The assessment consists of a written exam (90 minutes) (following §4(2) of the examination regulation). The exam takes place in every semester. Re-examinations are offered at every ordinary examination date.

Please pay attention to:

- Recurrence, whether the specific course is offered in the semester which you study at KIT
- Language: English or German
- **LV Code: T-WIWI-102606, not the event number 2581950 (essential to Learning Agreement).**
- One Course (Teilleistung) contains lecture, practice, tutoria

Lecture (in German: Vorlesung):

- Big room with many students. Less interaction
- registration is not necessary, but you have to add the lectures in your “Study Plan” in the Campus Management System, so that you can register the exams later on.

Tutorial

- supplementary offering to lectures that covers a large amount of material. Senior students (so-called tutors) supervise groups of 10–20 participants
- Here, students can solve exercises independently and have more time for their own questions. Registration necessary via Campus Management System / Ilias / During the first lecture hour

Seminar

- Students work on a particular topic, write about it and prepare and present it to the group

Practice (in German: Übung)

- a type of class designed to complement lectures. It typically involves practical exercises, problem-solving, and discussions to help students better understand and apply the materials covered in lectures. And it is carried out by a lecturer

4.2 Non-curricular Courses (ÜQ/SQ-Leistungen)

- **German courses: KIT Studienkolleg**

Registration period for the winter term 2025/2026: **23rd October 2025 online via Campus + Lotary: 24th October 2025**. International students currently enrolled at KIT are entitled to one German course per semester free of charge.

- **Other language courses: KIT Sprachzentrum**

Registration: **April 14 (9:00 am) - April 15 (3:00 pm)**

You can apply for a **maximum of 2 courses**. **One free course per semester. Remember to register early for next semester!**

- **FORUM – Studium Generale. Forum Wissenschaft und Gesellschaft**

Forum provides interdisciplinary courses and programs that integrate cultural studies with practical applications, promoting global cultural competencies and interdisciplinary research. Registration **from October 16 2025 at 12:00 possible**

- **House of Competence (HoC):**

Offers a variety of soft skill courses and training programs to enhance students' competencies in areas such as communication, leadership, and personal development. Registration period: October 21, 12:00 to October 24, 12:00.

- If you have taken FORUM, HoC, or language courses and/or seminars, please go to “ÜQ/SQ-Leistungen” in the Campus Management System in “Exam Registration and Unregistration”. Here are the courses that are not listed in the ToR yet. You can click on “assign” to add them to your ToR.
- The brick “Self-Booking-HOC-SPZ-ZAK-STK-Graded” or “Self-Booking-HOC-SPZ-ZAK-STK-Ungraded” must be chosen beforehand in the study schedule for the module “M-WIWI-104910 - Interdisciplinary Qualifications” in the section “Other KIT-Departments Courses and Interdisciplinary Qualifications”.

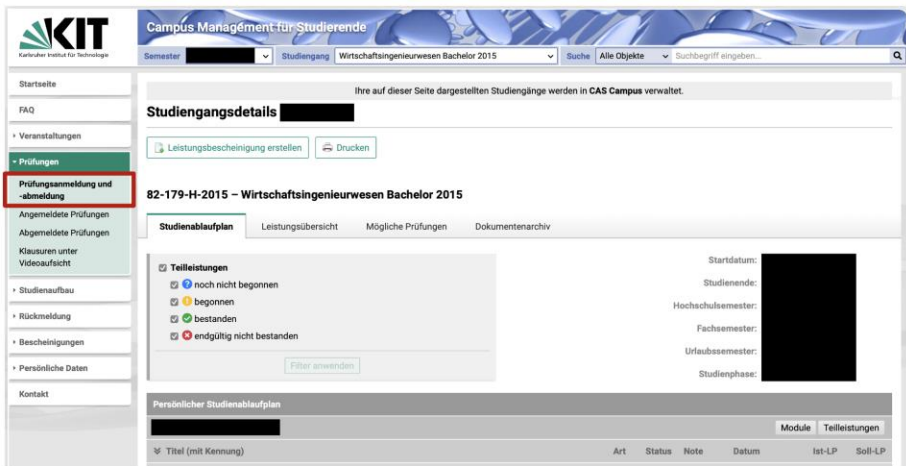

4.4 Learning Agreement

Requirements for filling out your Learning Agreement

The minimum ECTS points of your Learning Agreement for each exchange semester at WiWi Department are **15 ECTS**.

At least **70%** of your total credits must be courses **you find in the module handbook for non-degree students from the KIT-Department of Business and Economics**. The rest can be chosen freely from the KIT-wide course offer. The rest of the courses can be chosen freely from other KIT departments / faculties.

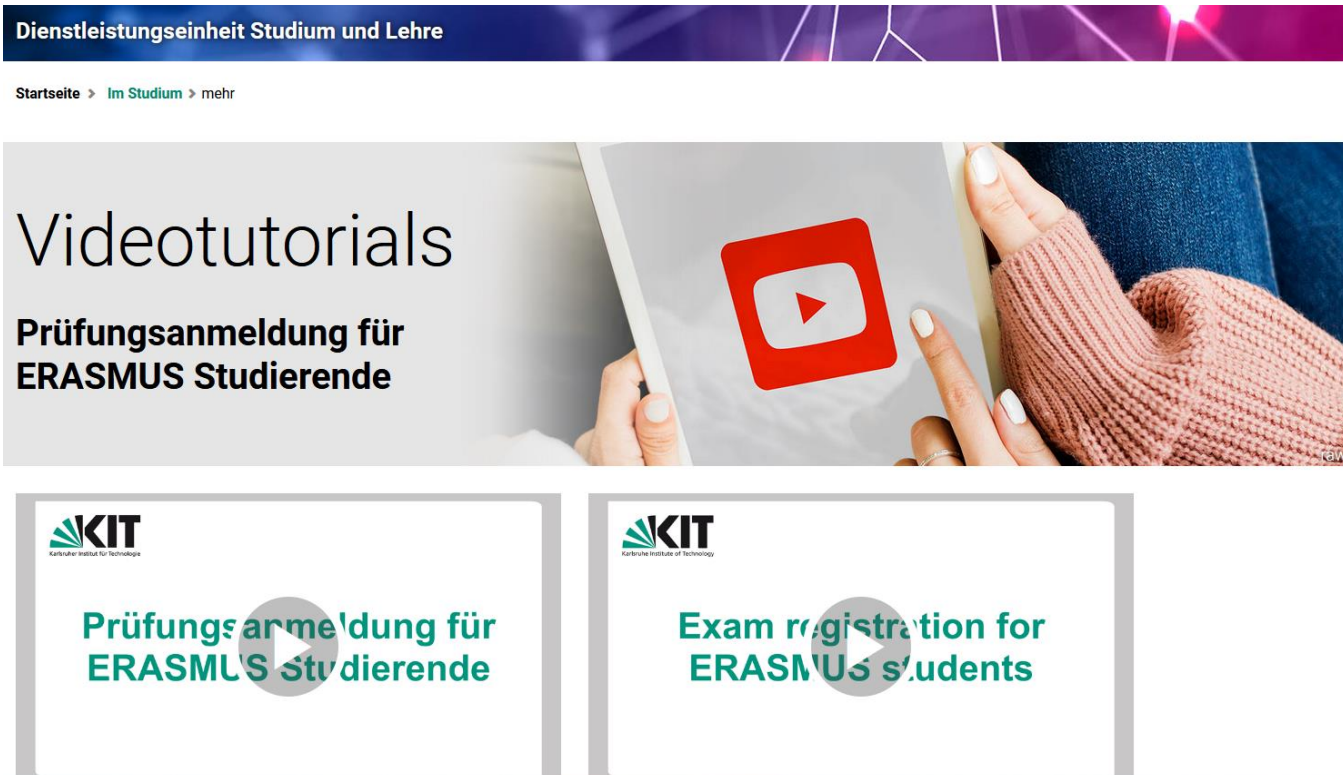
You can attend both Bachelor's and Master's courses but you have to check with your home university if the recognition is possible.

Please choose only courses from the current semester. Some courses are offered only once a year – either in the winter or summer term

You can change or update your Learning Agreement **within two weeks after the start of the lecture period**. Changes after that are only possible under certain circumstances

If your university already uses the EWP (Erasmus Without Paper) system, please first submit your Digital Learning Agreement (DLA) via your home university's portal. Once your home university coordinator has approved and signed the DLA, it will be transferred to Mobility Online. In this case, the Learning Agreement in PDF format will not be

Video tutorials for Erasmus students



If you don't need the **post-exam review appointment**, please let the examnier or his office knwo. Otherwise you will have to wait for the publication of your grades.

Lectures, Tutorials

- Exams typically cover the material from lectures plus exercises – explicit registration for the exam is required
- Exams are normally written, after the lecture period
- You can only retake the exams if you don't pass the exam
- **Please make sure that the appointment for the retake examination aligns with your return date, or that you are able to retake the exam orally online after your return..**

Seminars

- Grading a seminar typically involves several components, e.g.:
 - Participation in group work / projects
 - Presentations
 - Written assignments

Additional requirements

- For some courses there are additional requirements, e.g.:
 - Compulsory attendance
 - Registration for exams at the institute in addition to regular registration
 - Additional assignments during term: Please follow the instructions given by the lecturer!
 - If you are going to take an exam which is not offered by WiWi department, you need to fill out a [formular](#) and send to the examiner for his / her signature

Why Karlsruhe?

- Located in Karlsruhe, KIT provides convenient access to major European cities such as Paris (2 hours 40 minutes by train), Zurich (2 hours 40 minutes by train), Amsterdam (5 hours 30 minutes by train), and Berlin (6 hours by train)
- With around 300,000 inhabitants, Karlsruhe is the third-largest city in Baden-Württemberg, offering a wide range of leisure and cultural activities. Additionally, Karlsruhe is a safe city with easy access to biking, whether around the city itself or in its green surroundings
- New study: Karlsruhe is the city with the best English skills



Living Costs

The cost of living in Karlsruhe is moderate compared to other major German cities. On average, exchange students should budget around **€650 to €1,100 per month** to cover essential expenses. Here's a rough breakdown:

- **Rent (including utilities):** €350–€600 (depending on location and type of accommodation)
- **Food and groceries:** €200–€300
- **Leisure, clothing, and personal expenses:** €100–€200

Besides these costs, you have to pay the semester ticket and health insurance (if not already covered).

Transportation



- Use the KVV-net everyday from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. and every weekend and on Holidays for free with your KIT card and your KVV certificate (you can download it from Campus Management System)
- Studikarte of KVV: €229 /semester (6 months); throughout the KVV-net, If you want to travel outside these hours
- Next-Bike for free for students
- Deutschland-Ticket: €52/month; D-Ticket JugendBW (365 Euro / year): throughout Germany for all means of local public transport (not IC, EC, ICE)

Public holidays in Baden-Württemberg

In Germany, both public holidays and school holidays differ from one Federal State to the next. Karlsruhe is located in the state of Baden-Württemberg, which means the following public holidays apply, along with certain protective regulations.

- German Unity Day (October 3)
- All Saints' Day (November 1)
- First and Second Christmas Day (25/26 December)

Please note that the super markets are closed on Sundays and on those public holidays.

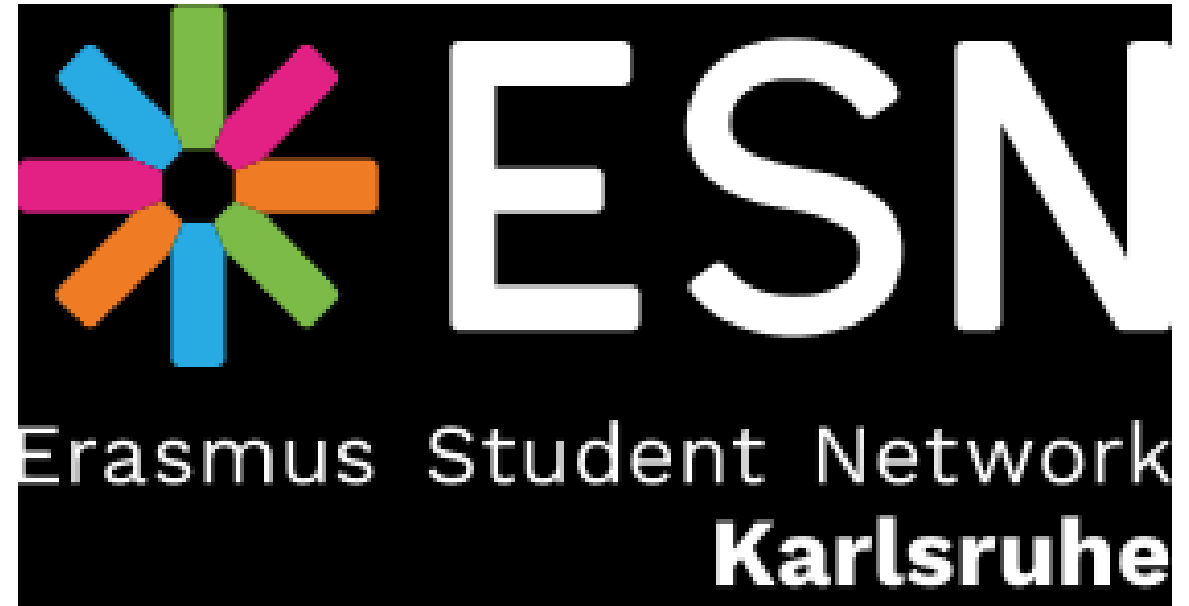
